## HAVE YOU CHECKED OUT WHAT'S BEEN ADDED TO THE COMMUNITY RADIO NETWORK?

### 1200 DEGREES (1 x 55'50)

DJ D, Australia's Premier Turntablist, creates a mix on the 1200s (turntables) using a DVS (digital vinyl system), 12" or 7" vinyl, with original samples of tracks played taking us on a journey through the decades, from the 1950s to now. (2RDJ)

### 1200 TWELVES (1 x 55'50)

A project of 1200 Degrees and DJ D, 1200 Twelves is a DJ mix spun by one of 100 DJs from around the globe who were tasked with creating a mix from 12 of their 12" vinyl records, all adding up to 1200 twelves. Each episode will feature 1-2 DJs mixing live with minimal talk breaks in between. (2RDJ)

### BUBBLE POP (1 x 27'50)

So, what actually goes on in Parliament House? Two journalists new to the Canberra press gallery chat about the week in politics, breaking down what happens in the nation's Parliament for people who don't live inside 'the Canberra bubble'. (CBAA / National Radio News)

### MUSIC, MOTHERS & OTHERS (27'50)

Somewhere in the music industry, between 'sex drugs and rock and roll' and The Wiggles, is the rest of us. 'Music Mothers and Others' is an audio parents group — a chance to discuss how parenting fits (or doesn't) into music industry life. (2SER)

### THE QUIET CARRIAGE (27'50)

A dedicated literature show about (mostly) new novels whilst featuring in-depth interviews with the authors behind them. Make sure to grab your favourite hot drink and sit down with the book and the author as you travel on The Quiet Carriage! Hosted by Paul J Laverty. (Main FM)

### BEATS, RHYMES AND LIFE (55'50)

Presented each week by Gav, Beats, Rhymes and Life is Australia's Hip Hop Show. It's BRL, Son: hear Oz Hip Hop, celebrate the greats, re-live the classic and chat the best in the genre. (Twin Cities FM)

### THE CHILL (2 x 55'50)

Corey Barnett brings you the Top 40 from the 90s-to-now! Hear all the major chart hits from 1990 to 2020, plus a weekly AMRAP Top 5 that is all-Australian. If it's current in the charts, or rarely on the radio anymore, it's on The Chill. (Highland FM)

### A BREATH OF FRESH AIR (2 x 18'00 + 1 x 16'00)

A light and breezy mix of music, interviews and interesting stories from the worlds of music and entertainment. Sandy's warm, relaxed, magazine takes listeners behind the scenes and features informal chats with our favourite musicians and moviemakers. We meet international superstars and up and coming locals. Showcasing their work, loves and lives.
